She was very nervous about how she would do this but she knew she wanted to read the passage about Jesus calming the storm. She called Carolyn often to get assurance that she was understanding the passage correctly and she wanted help finding a "souvenir" phrase that she could prepare to give each one as a

Lu called again after the Bible study to tell Carolyn how well it had gone and how the passage had perfectly met the needs of several. Miles doesn't attend this group and often reminds us that he doesn't believe like we do, though we know God is working in his life!

(Unfortunately, he found spelling errors in it!) When Carolyn asked about his girlfriend he said, "As I was praying I realized that she wasn't the one God has for me."
